RISE was formed by the merger of two important organizations in San Luis Obispo County: The North County Women's Shelter & Resource Center and the Sexual Assault Recovery & Prevention Center of San Luis Obispo County. For more information, read our story or email us. GUIDING PRINCIPLES People have a fundamental human right to a life free from sexual violence and an intimate partner. Sexual and intimate violence of partners can be prevented. Everyone has a role and responsibility in doing this job. Sexual and intimate violence on the part of partners exists in the system of oppression. Advocacy, education, prevention and public policy are key to social change. Cooperation and alliance building are essential for successful work against violence. Diversity and safe, accessible services are essential for creating social change and the environment. The voices of the survivors drive our work; we empower them to make while providing compassionate services, dignity, privacy and respect. October was the National Month of Awareness of Domestic Violence and RISE reminds people that help is a phone. I just know there's no help, they don't have to go through it alone, there are options, said Stacey Salome, RISE Director of Development and Marketing. The free RISE crisis line is staffed 24 hours a day — 855-886-RISE (7473). What we want people to know this month is that we are here for them regardless of their situation and that we are a resource that is nonjudgemental, that we will listen and can point them to options that can work for them, she said. The crisis line is not only for people who are currently experiencing violence. It's for their friends, it's for their family, it's for anyone who feels like they need to provide support to someone in this situation, Salome added. Salome said RISE saw an increase in domestic violence during PANDEMIA COVID-19. She said there had been a 30 per cent increase in calls to service in previous years. Because of all the traumas associated with COVID, Salome said, stress on relationships now, even healthy relationships, stress is greater than normal. For us as an organisation, we have seen that we have had quite a significant increase in the number of calls to our crisis line. Rise's motto is Respect. Inspire. Support. License. His vision is a world free from sexual and intimate violence on the part of partners. The Sexual Assault Recovery and Prevention Center of San Luis Obispo and the North County Women's Shelter and Resource Center merged in 2013 to form RISE. SARP started as rape crisis center SLO in 1975 and NCWSRC was established in 1982. The agencies have many years of experience and provide the following services to those affected by intimate partner violence and sexual assault/sexual exploitation: 24-hour crisis line, crisis intervention, case management, restraining order assistance, accompaniment and advocacy, prevention education, two safe houses and individual and group counselling. All services are provided confidentially, free of charge and in English and Spanish to anyone, regardless of age, sexuality, gender identity, race, class or skill, who has been directly or indirectly affected by partner violence or sexual assault. COVID-19 has led to isolation and people being detained at home with their tormentors without access to usual help routes or even privacy to call the emergency line. At the moment, people don't have the same ability, and so we've seen that it affects the amount of domestic violence going on, and the only isolation and ease in which people are able to access our services is really concerning, said Salome. When people call, Salome said that listening is essential. We will understand what is happening to them, Salome said. These are individual relationships. Often people will assume Salome said that a person wants to leave or has to leave. If what they want, we will help them facilitate that, Salome. If, for some reason, and they can't, we're not going to pressure them to do something like that or that. We will listen to their situation, what support they need and provide resources that can help them with their unique needs. Safety is also a priority. When someone leaves a violent relationship often, that's the most dangerous time for them and what our line can provide as well is just security planning, said Salome. Throughout the pandemic RISE continued its services, albeit with some shift. We still have services available to survivors at all times, Salome said. We've done a lot more virtual. Our employees went to work from home, except for our executives and the necessary employees in shelters. We have increased the capabilities of our therapeutic department. We have a few more therapists on board,' she added. RISE works with Regenerative Partners to promote education that ends domestic violence.
